## **Army ROTC National High School Scholarship**

### Benefits

- Pays 100% tuition and fees (regardless of residency) OR room and board (up to \$10,000)
- Book allowance of \$1,200 per year
- Monthly stipend of \$300-\$500 (depending on academic level)

### How to Apply

- The application opens on the 1st of June for students entering their senior year and closes on January 10th.

- Click "Take the next step: Create an account" toward the bottom.
- Follow the instruction to complete your application.

### What to expect

- You will be notified to take a **physical fitness test** which can be graded by a high school coach or athletic staff. The test consists of one-minute timed push ups, one-minute timed sit ups, and a one-mile run.
- You will also be notified to schedule an interview once you have completed the online application and physical fitness test. This interview will be conducted at an Army ROTC department with the Professor of Military Science. It is encouraged to conduct this interview at the ROTC department you will attend if possible.
- Once your application is complete your application status should display as "boarded" or "board ready." If you have completed everything above and it does not show this please contact your local Army ROTC Enrollment and Scholarship Officer.

### Things to remember

- There are **three rounds of scholarship selections every year** with the last round typically held in late February or early March. If you are not awarded a scholarship during one board your application will be "rolled" to the next board to be reviewed again.
- You can expect to be notified of the results before you graduate high school.
- Thinking of enlisting in the National Guard or Army Reserves? Soldiers in the National Guard and Army Reserves are not eligible for these scholarships.
- There are 42 ways to enter into Army ROTC, this is only one. So, if you are not awarded a scholarship through this process there are campus-based scholarships, National Guard and Reserve options, and numerous other ways for those who desire to become an Army Officer through Army ROTC to join.
