

What will MS students learn?

What will girls learn and why does it matter?

- Whether by diffusing a situation with the right words or knowing when to get help from an adult, girls learned to stand up for themselves and others.
- Girls recognized what healthy friendships look like and can now develop more of them.
- Girls develop relationship skills and can now make better decisions to avoid forming cliques, gossiping and teasing others.
- Girls can resolve conflicts more peacefully a skill needed daily!
- Girls develop skills to deal with today's relationship issues which involve via social media and texting as well as in-person.

Girl Scouts is addressing four outcomes in this program:

- Healthy relationships
- Community problem solving
- Conflict resolution
- · Strong sense of self

Girls will be pre and post surveyed for these outcomes in order to measure the success of the program.

Middle school is a crucial time of transition and adjustment and is also when bullying behavior tends to peak, making these years the most important time to promote core values and develop critical social and leadership skills. More than 180,000 students miss school daily in the United States due to fear of bullying by their peers. This program helps girls have voices to make change in order to help them feel safe and confident at school in a girl-only space.

Girl Scout staff will deliver the program weekly. Please ask your daughter about the program. At the conclusion of the curriculum, girls will work together to develop a take action project to change the culture of their school community. Girls may want to discuss their project ideas with their family.

iPad/Devices

With the new semester upon us, I would like to update you on a new expectation for all Wahoo Middle School students. Having the 1:1 iPad device is a tremendous tool for students and staff, and no doubt plays a huge role in academic success and preparing our students for the future. With that being said, students will have new expectations for second semester, with regard to being prepared for class with these devices. Students will now be required to have their iPads charged at a minimum of 80% at the start of each school day. If a student's device is not sufficiently charged at this percentage, he/she will be given an office referral. If a student is given three or more office referrals, then he/she will be required to keep the iPad at school. If a student continues to have problems with the iPad being sufficiently charged and prepared for the school day, then more consequences will be issued and plans will developed.

Having iPads charged and ready for use at the beginning of the school day is vital for effective classroom instruction. We view students not having their iPads charged and ready to go as being unprepared for learning.

We appreciate your support with this new expectation, and ask for your assistance at home in making sure the devices are being charged and are ready to go for the next school day.


