# Vaping & E-Cigarettes....PARENTS BEWARE!

Wahoo Public Schools, as well as schools across the state and country, have seen an significant increase of vaping by students during the school day. Vaping and juuling (or e-cigarettes) is challenging to monitor in schools because of the equipment size and lack of odor and smoke. The equipment used by many students can be as small as a computer pin drive.

Vaping or juuling involves the inhalation of vaporized ecigarette fluid consisting of water, nicotine, a propylene glycol base or vegetable glycerin and occasionally an aroma. The lack of smoke inhalation is what makes many electronic cigarette users believe that vaping is a safer alternative to smoking.

Since e-cigarettes were developed in 2003, it is difficult to say what long-term effects can occur after prolonged use. However, doctors and scientists do know that the liquid of electronic cigarettes often contains propylene glycol. It is understood that the chemical, which is also used to produce theatrical smoke, irritates the eyes and causes respiratory infections.

In recent years, the consumption of regular cigarettes among adolescents has declined, while the use of electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes) has increased. Be aware, and PLEASE have conversations with your son or daughter.
