Spring Semester Portfolio for Year 2 Students

This document is a digital package of all assignments assigned to the Year 2 Students during the Spring Semester.

In addition to the SCC dual credit pathway courses, SENCAP students complete a supplemental online student portfolio. The student portfolio assignments provide the student an opportunity to explore a variety of careers in their pathway of interest. Portfolio assignments also encourage self-reflection, personal development, goal setting, and discussion among like-minded peers.

The portfolio assignments are due Wednesdays by 11:59 p.m. and on average take 20-30 minutes to complete. Students access the portfolio class through Canvas, SCC's online platform. All SENCAP students have a regional coordinator who will provide feedback on the portfolio assignments, visit the high schools, and arrange field trips.

Each semester students are required to participate in the following out of school learning opportunities: one field trip, one job shadow, and one related professional day and/or workshop. Whereas every portfolio assignment prepares each student in career and college exploration, the highlighted assignments in the <u>index</u> are further developed upon at professional days and/or workshops.

Part 2: Accomplishing More Using Your CliftonStrengths

People perform better when they get the chance to do what they naturally do best. You give yourself a better chance to succeed when you know your CliftonStrengths and use them in a thoughtful, meaningful way.

Think about the answers to the following questions...

- 1. What are your Top 5 themes.
- 2. Briefly describe a recent success you've had.
- 3. How do you think your CliftonStrengths play a role in this success?
- 4. What is one goal (could be one of your SMART goals) you are currently working toward?
- 5. Which of your themes do you think you can most rely on to accomplish this goal?
- 6. Now, combine the strongest aspects of each answer to create a written answer to the common interview question "tell me about yourself".

Your statement could be a combination of:

For example: Tell a little bit about where you've been (Question 2 - recent success), how you approach a task or job responsibility (Questions 1, 3, 5 - Gallup strength), and where are you going (Question 4 -a goal or statement connecting to why you are interviewing).

- TIP: When you read it back to yourself, your response should last 45-60 seconds.
- <u>***This written response may be useful when you create your cover letter later on in the semester.</u>

NOTE for **Video Prep**: You will create a video **after** you submit your written response and receive feedback from your Coordinator.

Strengths and Career Discovery: Planning

4. Using your research from the Applying Talents in Career Discovery website, select two of your strengths and share which observations and suggestions you identified with. And then also write about how that observation connects to your career paths you are considering.

Transitioning into the workplace


As you transition into the workplace, it is good to know what skills are desired by companies.

According to the chart below, there are four "absolutely essential/essential" competencies desired by hiring organizations.

- 1. <u>Critical Thinking/Problem Solving</u>
- 2. <u>Professionalism/Work Ethic</u>
- 3. Oral/Written Communications
- 4. Teamwork/Collaboration

Imaginary scenario:

You recently found out about a part-time job that would be perfect for you. It is meaningful work for good pay, and it gives you time to also concentrate on the college classes required for your dream job. Part of the application for this job requires that you come up with <u>the most convincing arguments</u> for...Why use LinkedIn?

To be considered for the interview for the job there are <u>minimum requirements/qualifications</u> for your post.

Minimum qualifications: Why use LinkedIn?:

- Exactly 3 reasons answering "Why use LinkedIn?"
- Support/evidence for each reason
- Provide the source of your information

Now, <u>convince the reader</u>, and be selected for the interview.

In Week 11, you will need to interview a professional. It might take some time to get the interview scheduled...so we suggest that you start to make some contacts NOW so you can call, email, or talk in person with a professional in any job/career that you want.

You have **2 weeks to complete this assignment** but start on this right away, as it may take a couple days to get a hold of someone.

Be prepared to ask the professional the following questions, then record the answers. You will not submit the answers here because this is the prep assignment.

- 2. What is your current job?
- 3. What's a typical work week like?

- 8. What is your salary? (they may not want to answer this, it's fine if they don't)
- 9. What education or skills are needed to do this?
- 10. What advice would you offer someone considering this career?
- 11. How much time off do you get/take?
- 12. What is a common misconception people have about what you do?

(Earn 1 point of extra credit for each additional question that you ask and record the answer.)

Now, to earn the points for this assignment, answer the following:

- 1. Who will you interview? Give at least 2 possibilities.
- 2. How will you contact them? Do you have their phone number? Email?
- 3. If you don't get a response on your initial contact, how long will you wait until you contact them again?
- 4. If you get no response at all, how long will you wait before trying a different contact?

- Did you hand write a thank you?
- Did you send an email?
- What did you say? Did you say anything specific about something that happened during your shadow?
- What are the benefits to writing a thank you?

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Explore for your future

The purpose of this assignment is for you to **research**, **explore**, **and learn more about your options after you finish high school**.

There are 2 options to choose from. You are only required to complete 1 of the options.

Option 1-- In person experience : (this would be likely the more meaningful option)

If you took a trip outside of school sometime this semester to research, explore, and learn--examples might include: a college visit, an additional job shadow, a business tour, SCC Discovery Day, a career fair, etc.--then you can earn credit by reflecting on your in-person experience. Use the Research, Explore, and Learn Reflection Guide to help you reflect.

Option 2--Virtual experience:

If you don't have any in-person experiences to reflect on, then you can research, explore, and learn virtually. Here are links to websites that you could use to help you research, explore, and learn. You can also choose your own. ***Please choose a DIFFERENT site than first semester, if you are a returning student.

Virtual Field Trip

In the fall semester of your SENCAP portfolio, your coordinator will schedule a field trip to a business within your academy pathway. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, this year, this field trip will be a virtual experience. The goal of the field trip is for you to **experience and learn more about your options after you finish high school.**

For this assignment, you will use the Nebraska Career Clusters website to learn more about a Nebraska based business.

• You will use the company's website to help you learn more about this company. Google the company's name and go to the main page.

What is your first impression of the business based upon the website?

Next, look over the website for a link to a page that will tell you more about the company. The link is usually labeled something like: About Us / About / Company History Share three pieces of information you learned from this page about this company.

• Still using the company's website, try to find the company's values, mission statement, and vision. Many businesses post this information online and you may be able to still find it on the About Us / About / Company History page. If you cannot find it, read through that About page and look for bold font designed to get your attention.

What is this company's mission? What are the values of this company? Why do you think it is important to know these things? How you feel about the company knowing these pieces of information? How did the experience change, affect, or impact you?

• The virtual field trip video should have educated you on what career opportunities are available with this company.

List two specific job/career opportunities with this company.

Using the company's website, learn more about careers. Usually the link to information about careers is labeled something similar to: Careers / Job Opportunities / Work Here / Employment and sometimes this information is located at the bottom of the page. Once you find it, click on it to learn more about working for this company.

In at least 4 sentences, write about what you see on this web page. Some questions to consider: Does it list open jobs? Does it say what kind of employee they seek? Is it confusing? Could you work here? Are there any employee perks?

• Refer to your five Gallup Strengths to answer this question.

Imagine you are an employee for this company. Which strength would you use? Why? How would you use it?

Semester Reflection

Write about what you learned and accomplished this semester. Include the following items in your reflection:

- 1. Explain if you felt the Career Academy was effective in introducing you to college-level coursework and careers or colleges you are interested in pursuing.
- Reflect over the SCC course, specifically was the course load difficult compared to other classes this semester, would you recommend other students in your school to take this course, and your personal level of success.
- 3. Identify what you think was most beneficial to you in the portfolio this semester: field trips, job shadows, the course itself, etc.
- 4. Share where you are at working toward your SMART goals you made at the beginning of the semester. Restate your goals and what you have or haven't done to get to where you are.
- 5. If you could change one thing about this semester what would it be?
- 6. What do you think you've learned since, first semester?
- 7. Overall, what has this experience taught you what have you learned?
- 8. If you are a junior, do you think you will participate next year? If so, why or why not?
- 9. If you are a senior, do you plan to continue in the same field of study? If so, why or why not?
