Nebraska Shakespeare is committed to keeping education endeavors relevant and engaging. For twelve years, Nebraska Shakespeare has molded activities to the needs of schools. Actor/educators hold a bachelor's degree or higher, are versed in Shakespeare's works and style, and receive daily guidance from the Director of Education, whose year-round work with schools and communities forms ongoing connections with students. Workshops provide direct connection to the performance, break down the text with practical exercises, and relate applications to moments and scenes from the play. Participants make immediate connections and develop a deeper comprehension.

SHAKESPEARE ON TOUR offers three educational outlets: in-depth study guides, pre- and post-performance workshops, and interactive post-show discussions. All are designed in alignment with Nebraska education standards. The program strives to practice and build communication skills; broaden vocabulary fluency; and expand student comprehension through analysis of text, plot, genre and themes of the play.


