A Proclamation

During National Veterans and Military Families Month, we salute the brave and dedicated patriots who have worn the uniform of the United States, and we celebrate the extraordinary military families whose selfless service and sacrifice make our military the finest in the world.

Our Nation's veterans represent the best of America. Generation after generation, men and women have answered the call to defend our country and our freedom, facing danger and uncertainty with uncommon courage. They make tremendous sacrifices by leaving their families to serve throughout the homeland and in combat, contingency, and humanitarian operations worldwide.

Our heroes have always relied on their families for strength and support. Serving alongside our men and women in uniform are spouses, siblings, parents, and children who personify the ideals of patriotism, pride, resilience, service above self, and honor. They endure the hardships and uncertainty of multiple relocations, extended trainings, and deployments because of their admirable devotion to our country and a loved one in uniform.

President Ronald Reagan said, "America's debt to those who would fight for her defense doesn't end the day the uniform comes off." Our Nation's veterans fulfilled their duty to this country with brave and loyal service; it is our moral and solemn obligation to demonstrate to them our continuing gratitude, unwavering support, and meaningful encouragement.

Nebraska Army National Guard

I was born in Fremont NE, and went to high school locally at Archbishop Bergan in Fremont. I enlisted my senior year in 2008 as a 35F, All Source Intelligence Analyst. I joined because I wanted adventure and to see life with a different perspective, and do something with purpose.

The National Guard took me all over the United States for different training events. I went to college at Midland University (while continuing to serve) and received a bachelor's degree in criminal justice and psychology, and an associate's degree in applied



behavioral analysis. I served two state Active Duty missions: one in 2011 to assist with the flooding in Plattsmouth, NE, and in 2017 for Hurricane relief efforts when Hurricane Maria and Irma hit the U.S. Virgin Islands.

I've served two years working Counter Drug missions as a criminal analyst, working alongside the Nebraska State Patrol, Homeland Security, FBI and DOJ, specifically to analyze drug interdictions, prime projections and profiles of drug mules. I've spent one year working as a Biometric report developer in Ft. Leavenworth, KS, using intelligence analysis tools and databases to develop biometric identification analysis reports on assigned subjects. I was deployed to Northern Iraq in 2016-2017 for the Liberation of Mosul from ISIS control. I have worked as the ISR Collection manager to use aerial assets to collect and lead targeting efforts of collective ISIS personnel.

Additionally, I served as the J2 Current Operations NCOIC, maintaining actionable intelligence and worked closely with coalition partners (France, Belgium, Great Britain, Finland, and Canada). I provided our Commanding General with multi-discipline intelligence target packets to action targeting efforts to include High Valued individuals, and briefed all targets residing in Mosul to the CJTF Commanding General. While serving part time in the National Guard, I was a Paralegal for Fidelity National Title Company, until I accepted a full time position as a Recruiter for the Nebraska Army National Guard.
