



Assessed Valuation




Total Levy





Career Education Opportunities (CEOs)

The Career Exploration Opportunities (CEOs) program assists Wahoo High School students with understanding the linkages between school and work. Through CEOs, students explore and discover their passions, confidence, and skills through a worksite experience in a career cluster of interest. Students are given the opportunity to enhance what they have learned in the classroom in a real-world environment; our community becomes an extension of their education.

The CEOs partnership between education and business provides a student the opportunity to learn firsthand, about the skill and educational requirements necessary for career areas in which they are interested.



Some of the defining characteristics of the CEOs program are fundamental to work-based learning, such as:

- A close relationship between students' classroom instruction and their workplace experience.
- Offering quality workplace experiences for students.
- Non-traditional scheduling that demonstrates a willingness to make systemic change.
- Joint business-educator development of program.


NATIONAL Testing – NWEA MAP

Wahoo Public Schools utilize the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessments for our nationally-normed achievement test. These tests are administered to students in grades 1st – 8th. Reading, Math and Science tests are administered during the Fall and Winter testing terms. The scores are represented as a RIT score.




MAP Math (WES)




MAP Math (WMS)






NATIONAL Testing – NWEA MAP

MAP assessments provide ongoing data related to a student’s readiness for instruction and their growth in particular subject areas. The tests adaptive nature provides teachers and administrators with an opportunity to better identify what individual students are ready to learn. The charts directly to the right show a relative cohort of students as they move from grade level to grade level. *You can follow each group of students from year to year within the same color band at a downward angle.*

STATE Testing – NSCAS Growth


During spring of the 2021-22 school year, the statewide summative assessment is administered to all students in 3rd – 8th grades. These tests are known as the Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System (NSCAS

Growth) and are conducted in Reading, Math, and Science. With each NSCAS assessment, a student's score falls into one of three categories:




NSCAS ELA (3rd - 8th)

Best Communities for Music Education 2021-22 School Year




During the 2021-22 school year, Wahoo Public Schools was recognized nationally as one of the Best Communities for Music Education for the second consecutive year! Testing – Pre ACT

During the 2022-23 school year, the PreACT was administered to all 2nd year HS students (Sophomores). The PreACT results provide an early indicator of college readiness in the form of skills and higher order thinking. Wahoo High School had 76, 10th graders complete the ACT in October of 2022. These results are communicated with families and staff use them to inform instruction during many core classes.

WPS PreACT (Fall) - 10th graders




STATE Testing – ACT

During the 2021-22 school year, the ACT was administered as the statewide summative for all 3rd year HS students (Juniors). The ACT results provide an indicator of college readiness in the form of skills and higher order thinking. Wahoo High School had 85, 11th graders complete the ACT in Spring of 2022. The state has established cut scores to indicate whether a student completing the ACT is “On Track” for future success in college. Those scores begin at the following: ELA = 18; Math = 18; Science = 19




ACT 21-22 (11th graders)

Dual Credit (SENCAP)

Wahoo Public Schools offers opportunities for students to pursue college-level courses both on campus and via distance learning. Wahoo High School partners with Southeast Community College and is proud to offer high school students the opportunity to enroll in Southeast Nebraska Career Academy Partnership (SENCAP) which offers several Academies: Agriculture, Business, Construction, Criminal Justice, Education, Health Sciences, Information Technology, and Manufacturing in Energy and Welding.

Juniors and seniors in high school have the opportunity to take college-level coursework in a career field of their interest, and also have multiple opportunities to explore their career in a hands-on approach through job shadowing, field trips, professional speakers, and annual events highlighting resume building, mock interviews, and other worthy career-related activities.
